FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Easter Sunday

Near the tomb of Jesus at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem there is a stone called “The Stone of Unction,” or “The Stone of Anointing.” After His crucifixion, this is where the body of Jesus was laid down, washed, and anointed with oil, wrapped in shrouds as the Jews customarily prepared their dead for burial before being placed into a burial cave. The tomb belonged to Joseph of Arimathea who donated it for Jesus’ burial. The stone has a red hue throughout and a strong perfume smell. The stone of anointing is available to all pilgrims to touch, spend time in prayer, and reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus for us. The stone smells so strongly of perfume because for centuries, devout women come to the tomb every evening and pour precious oil on the stone and gently rub it into the sacred site. This is where the body of the Lord laid before entering the tomb and still, like the women of the Gospel, Holy Women still come to offer Him this loving care.

The story of the Trial, Torture, Passion, Crucifixion, and Death of the Lord is so dramatic and so full of the imagery of hate, lies, judgement, pain, and cruelty, we can be forgiven for overlooking the grace and love that is also present in the story. Along the way, Jesus encountered gentleness, compassion, sorrow, grief, grace, love and even courage. As He took up His cross and carried it through the streets of Jerusalem while many mocked, jeered, spat, punched, and shoved, His Mother and the faithful women courageously walked with Him. The women of Jerusalem embraced Him and wept for Him as they were moved with compassion. Veronica came forward and wiped His bloody and sweating Holy Face with a towel. When He fell, Simon came forward to help carry His cross. While the priests and Pharisees mocked Him, a bystander offered Him a drink from a wet sponge on a reed. When one thief scolded Him, the other spoke kindly to Him and recognized His innocence. As He hung on the Cross, He looked at the beautiful face of His Mother, still there with Him as she had been from the beginning. He saw His friends Mary and Martha, Mary Magdalene, and St. John. Even in that moment of pain, He speaks gently to His Mother. At the end, Jesus also experiences faith, when the good thief asked to be remembered and when the centurion said, “surely this was the Son of God.” Then, after His death, Joseph of Arimathea takes Him from the Cross, places Him in the arms of His mother, and provides a tomb for His burial. His body, so abused and torn apart in butchery, is now tenderly washed, and prepared for burial. All of this is in the Gospel narrative, and all of this is kindness, amid the horror and hate, there was gentleness, goodness, and grace.

We don’t have to go far to find the horror of this world, or to hear of the misery in life, or see the pain inflicted on people. Everywhere we turn, there are stories of darkness, the hate, the evil, in life. It is so prevalent that we might be tempted to believe that this is all there is, and this is what life has become. Our news carries the images and stories of darkness all the time. If it is not bad news, it just is not news. That seems to be the motto. I’m no Pollyanna, I know there is darkness. But to be honest, to only see the dark, the death, the misery, the negative, this is not a true reflection of how we live, or who we are, or what we are about.

FR. BEN’S COLUMN CONTINUED

From my experience, the good outnumber the bad, kindness and generosity outweigh greed and grasping, the positive I see far outweighs the negative, light overcomes darkness. Everywhere I look, everywhere I go, in our parishes, I see people helping people, people caring for others, parents encouraging their children, communities supporting schools, programs, charities, good works, and helping strangers. In the horror of the Passion of the Lord, there is a golden thread of love and compassion. This golden thread is made present by those who have the courage to walk with Jesus, reach out to Him, and allow Him to touch their lives. They are not the loud, the powerful, the complainers, the judgmental, they are the quiet goodness, the gentle breeze, the kind remark, the ordinary people who prefer to lift up and help, encourage, and support. For us, the choice is obvious; we cannot choose to be the darkness because we belong to the light. It is our task to bring that light into the world and fan it into a flame that sets the world on fire. This is who we are, and this is what we do.

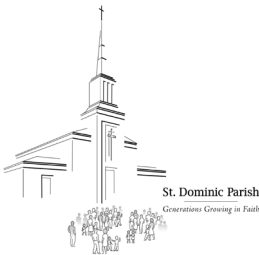

RECEIVE AN OHIO TAX CREDIT

The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) has been certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO).

In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, CEF-SGO provides financial-need-based scholarships to students in grades K-12 within the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Supporting students and their formation through Catholic Education, is a great way to share our blessings and faith with younger generations. The CEF-SGO may now allow for Catholic Education supporters to be able to receive a tax credit for their generosity.

Ohio taxpayers who donate to SGOs may be able to claim a dollar-for-dollar, non-refundable tax credit on their state income tax return for up to \$750.00 per donor (up to \$1,500.00 if married and filing jointly). (See section 5747.73 of the Ohio Revised Code.)

PLEASE NOTE: According to a representative from the Ohio Department of Taxation, if you file a married joint return, each taxpayer will need to make their own \$750.00 contribution to claim the maximum of \$1,500. Separate acknowledgement letters will be provided for documentation of your gifts.

HOW TO GIVE TO THE SGO: You can make a gift online at CatholicBestChoice.org/SGO or by sending in a check to Catholic Education Foundation-SGO, 100 E. Eighth Street, Cincinnati, Ohio 45202.

Consult with your tax advisor to determine (1) your eligibility for the tax credit, (2) its value to you, and (3) the details of your gift. Please understand that each individual's tax situation is different, and we strongly encourage you to reach out to a tax advisor for more information on how an SGO credit could affect your tax liability.
