BISHOP ROBERT BARRON'S "THE MASS"

Archbishop Schnurr has called for an archdiocese-wide study of the Holy Eucharist, during the six weeks of Ordinary Time between Christmas and Lent. The content of the study will be the excellent video series "The Mass" from Bishop Robert Barron's Word on Fire ministries. If you sign up at CatholicAOC. org/theMass, the archbishop will email the 25-minute episode along with his brief insights. Or better yet, come watch it with Fr. Chris and Fr. Jim on Tuesday nights, 7:00 p.m. in O'Connor Hall with discussion afterward. It won't take more than an hour. We will start January 10 and end February 21. There will be no session on February 7. Just for your information, this will not eliminate our Tuesdays in Lent Bible Study. We will be using Barron's "Seven Last Words," and the sessions will only last an hour.



ANOTHER WAY TO SUPPORT ST. DOMINIC

The IRS raised the age for Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) to age 72. However, you may still make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA account as long as you are at least age 72. If you are required to make an RMD, QCDs will satisfy your annual distribution requirement and will not be included in your taxable income for the year. This could be a great way to save taxes and financially support St. Dominic Parish. Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can come to this sacrament which will be communally celebrated annually. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death. Please call the parish emergency line. Someone will respond to your call. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN For the New Year Only God will do!

It's hard to believe that some of the people attending Mass today were not born when the movie "Jerry Maguire" first debuted. That was 1996 and the movie, a romantic comedy-drama starred Tom Cruise, Cuba Gooding Jr., Renée Zellweger, and Regina King. One of the most iconic lines in the movie, and one of the biggest lines of garbage in movie history, was when Jerry Maguire turned to Dorothy Boyd and, with tears in his eyes, emotionally, says to her: "you complete me." The sentiment is not unusual. In fact, this sort of expectation of another in relationships, courtships, and marriages, is very prevalent and, at the same time, very deadly. If you expect anyone else to complete you, in a friendship, a relationship, a marriage, or a family, you are destined for disappointment and failure.

The Book of Genesis tells us that nothing God had made was suitable as a friend for Adam, so God created Eve. Adam and Eve were made to be companions for each other, so that Adam would not be alone, he would have accompaniment in life. Human beings accompany each other in life, and through life. We are all born into relationships. The first relationship we have is with our parents, our mother, who first, in her own body and then from her own body, feeds us. We are sheltered, made safe, we learn, we grow, through our relationships. We make friends, we marry, we have children of our own, we are community beings, and we help each other, but we don't complete each other. And, to put those expectations on another, on a friend, a parent, a wife, a husband, a mother, father, son, daughter, brother, or sister, is to put too great a burden on them and to expect too much. The created world, and even the created person, is not enough to fill what only God's love can fill.

The truth is that the Book of Genesis also teaches us that God created us to be loved by Him and to love Him. We are created to be in relationship, first, with God. Created by God and for God, only God can fulfill us, only God's life, God's love, God's grace, can complete us. From within, we search for completeness, every person knows this, or at least feels this instinctively. Even those who have never heard of God seem to know that their soul, heart, being, longs for something more than the world can offer or give, even people, even the people we love most and who love us most, cannot fulfill the longing we hold deep within. Often, as we all know, we search for fulfillment in all sorts of places, people, and things. We discover that created things cannot take the place of the one uncreated thing we long to have and to love. Made for God, we long for God, and only God can fulfill that longing.

This is not to devalue the other riches in our lives, in fact, these also are gifts from God that are to help, enhance, brighten, give purpose, and they are signs of God's love and care for us. However, only God can fulfill us. As we begin a new year, if we want to find completeness, if we want to find our purpose and destiny, if we want to be fulfilled and live as fully as we can, we should let God enter our lives fully so that we might be complete and live life as God intends us to live it, to experience life as God intends us to experience it. Anything else, everything else, is just not enough. Only God!





LOVE YOUR SCHOOL AND WANT AN OHIO TAX **CREDIT?** – Ohio enacted Ohio revised code 5747.73 which created an Ohio tax credit of \$750.00 (single taxpayer) or \$1,500.00 (married filing jointly and each give a \$750.00 donation) for donations to an Ohio approved gualifying Scholarship Granting Organization. The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is on the short list of the 28 qualifying scholarship granting organizations for 2022. If you would like to donate specifically to St. Dominic School, you can earmark the donation in a donation to The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati as "St. Dominic School." Donations can easily be made online at CatholicBestChoice.org/SGO. Remember a credit is better than a tax deduction - because a credit is a dollar-for-dollar deduction from your Ohio taxes. Please note the credit is limited to the lesser of \$750.00 (single) \$1,500.00 (married) or your Ohio tax liability. Thank your for considering a gift!

You can also contact the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0 or parishoffice@stdominicdelhi.org to request a statement. **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR** – The application process for applying for financial assistance for the 2023-2024 school year is now open. If you have a high school student next year, and you have applied for assistance through FACTS, you do not have to complete the application for your St. Dominic student, as long as you have selected St. Dominic as one of your schools. PLEASE MAKE CERTAIN YOU HAVE SELECTED ST. DOMINIC AS ONE OF YOUR SCHOOLS.

To begin the application process, go to: www.factsmgt. com. In the upper left corner of the page, click on "Parent Log In." If you applied for assistance last year (2022-2023), your login credentials will be the same. If you are utilizing FACTS for tuition payment processing for this current school year, your login credentials are the same. Click on the link, "Apply for Financial Aid." The instructions for completing the application are relatively intuitive, however, if you experience any issues, please contact FACTS at 866-412-4637.

Awards will first be granted through the Catholic Education Foundation (The Archdiocese of Cincinnati's One Faith One Hope One Love Campaign). CEF awards will be announced in February 2023. St. Dominic will announce Parish awards in the Spring of 2023. **The deadline to apply for assistance is February 3, 2023 for CEF and St. Dominic Parish Awards. No exceptions can be made!** You will need your 2021 tax return information. You will also have to upload pages 1 and 2 from your 2021 tax return as well as copies of any 2021 W-2s.
