

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Let's not miss the religious significance of the feast we celebrate this weekend, All Saints, and its vigil, "All Hallows Eve," or Halloween. We celebrate all the saints in our long history as a



people of faith. Our church statues and windows remind us of some of them. Don't forget the saints in your own story of faith. We all have people in our lives who have influenced and inspired us for good. The feast of All Saints is the time to remember them and thank God for them.

November is a month-long celebration of the communion of saints and the remembrance of those who have gone before us. One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.
