FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Gather them In

When we were about eight and seven, myself and my brother David got into a pretty lively fight, more wrestling than punches. Brothers fighting, of course, is not unusual but, unfortunately for us, this fight was on the street in front of our house. Seemingly, our mother overheard our next-door neighbor saying, "Oh, isn't that terrible, brothers fighting." Not that her own boys were angels. This really annoyed my mother who was more upset at the neighbor's comment than our fighting. Just at that moment, another neighbor, Pat Flynn, was passing and Ma shouted out to him, "Pat, separate those two, will you, and give them a good clip around the ear." Which he was more than willing to do. Of course, when she got us inside there was more than a clip around the ear. On our street, every father and mother were your father and mother, and every child was your brother and sister. That's just the way we lived back then.

You see, on our street back home, everybody knew everybody. I can tell you the name of every adult, every child, every dog, and every cat that lived on our street. That is true for every child and adult that lived on our street. While we were individual families, we were also a family of families. Everyone watched out for each other. Older children babysat, watched out for, and protected the younger ones. All the kids on that street played together. The parents socialized together, helped each other with projects, took care of neighbors' kids when there was an emergency. No kid on that street went without a meal if their parents were late getting home for some reason. There was always enough room at a table for one more.

In the Gospel, a member of the crowd asks Jesus "Will many be saved?" In the reading from the Prophet Jeremiah, the Lord says, He is "coming to gather the nations." While in the Gospel, Jesus says, "enter through the narrow door," but at the same time, many will enter the Kingdom coming from every nation and place: "from the East and from the West, from the North and from the South."

"Lord, will many be saved?" is a good question and it is a question many ask. Another way we hear it expressed might be: Will there be many people in heaven? Or will there be many souls in Hell? I guess for me the question is not "Will many be saved?" That's a good question, but for me it puts the emphasis on others. We could put it another way: "Lord will I be saved?" or "Lord, what must I do to be saved?" The answer is easy, "Love God and your neighbor." Interestingly, Jesus Himself changes the emphasis of the question from "who" will be saved to "how" someone is saved. "Take the narrow door" Jesus says to the questioner. In other words, be more concerned about how you get there; focus on the journey, the way.

God desires the salvation of all His children. That's why the image we see today is that of a family gathered around a table eating. It is a familiar and comforting image. As a family, we want everyone to be cared for, fed, protected, gathered in a home, and surrounded by love. This is what God desires. If we care for God's family here on earth, we will be gathered into that family, around God's table, sharing God's company, in God's Kingdom. The Kingdom is open to all but, it is not possessed by all. It is possessed by those who seek it, who search for it, those who are willing to enter through the narrow door or follow the narrow path. Like God our Father, we should want all to be saved and we should do all we can to bring them into the family gathered around the one table. Only God knows who and how many will be saved, but we can all lend a hand in helping each other and in helping others we may find our own salvation.

PARENTAL PREPARATION FOR THEIR INFANT'S BAPTISM



ST. DOMINIC PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION (PSR) REGISTRATION 2022/2023




