FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Preparing for the Holy Spirit

There were over 300,000 orphans in Germany after the Second World War. Imagine what the number must have been if we included all the other countries that were involved or touched by that war: China, Philippines, Japan, France, Italy, Britain, Belgium, Egypt, Russia, Poland, Romania, to name just a few. Add to that the number of Jewish children made orphans by the terror of the Holocaust. Many of these children didn't just lose their parents, most lost their entire families, their homes, and even their identities. What must it be like to be left totally alone? How do you manage to survive when you have nothing, and you are just a small child? Where do you go, who do you go to? How hungry they must have been, how totally lost and alone. How do you overcome such a sense of abandonment, loss, and complete terror? What must it be like to be an orphan? We don't have to go back to World War II to see the devastation of war on children. According to a recent report from the Euro-Mediterranean Human Rights Monitor, a non-profit group, more than 24,000 children have also lost one or both parents in Gaza in the last few months. Tens of thousands of children have been orphaned and displaced in the Ukraine since the Russian invasion.

"I will not leave you orphans," Jesus says. Jesus promises to give us an advocate, the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is both a gift and a Divine representative, an advocate for us before God. The Holy Spirit will give us the gifts that are necessary to live a life that is complete, worthwhile, and enriched with God's love and grace. At the same time, this Holy Spirit, like Moses in the Old Testament and Jesus in the New, will stand before God to seek what we need, to ask for the gifts that will benefit us, to seek God's favor for us, and defend us before God, if necessary.

This Holy Spirit, Jesus says, abides within us. Now that is interesting. Why does the Holy Spirit abide in us? Well, He abides in us so that we can experience God's love, God's life, God's grace, God's power, and God's gifts rushing through our souls, our blood, and our lives. He abides in us so that we can feel and enjoy God's life in our lives. He abides in us, so we are not alone – not orphans.

The Holy Spirit also abides in us so that we might make Him present in our world. What is the Holy Spirit? He is a gift and an advocate. Maybe we are called to be the same. Maybe we are called to be the same so that no child feels like they are an orphan: forgotten, abandoned, hungry, frightened, alone, homeless, lost, without a friend, without a home, without an advocate. In fact, there is no "maybe" about it. We are called to be an advocate and a gift in the world so there are no more orphans. That's what building the Kingdom of God means. It means changing the world. And that, my friends, is our job. Jesus says to us: "I will not leave you orphans." We should say the same.

"I have loved you," Jesus said, "live in my love." He also asked His disciples to love one another just as He loved us. The Holy Spirit gives us every gift we need to make this sort of love, love that would die for another, present in our hearts, our lives, and our world. All we must do is live it. All we must do is make it real. This kind of love takes care of every child and makes sure we all have a home, enough to eat, and someone to care for us. This sort of love makes sure there are no orphans.


