

FR. BEN'S COLUMN**Jonah the Reluctant Prophet**

I love the story of Jonah, I always have, and I have always thought of Jonah as my kindred spirit. Not because I do not want to do what God wants me to do but, like most people, I would prefer to do what I want to do. It is not that Jonah simply did not want to do what God wanted him to do, no, Jonah deliberately and determinedly refused to go where God asked him to go, Jonah would not do what God asked him to do. God told Jonah to go to the great city of Ninevah, but Jonah physically went in the opposite direction. He crossed land, desert, and sea to escape God. Nevertheless, God pursued Jonah, and would not let him escape his mission and his responsibility. Even when Jonah did eventually surrender to God he did so reluctantly, begrudgingly, and he complained all the time about everything. Now, that is my sort of prophet! I can hear my own conversations with God echoed in the story of God and Jonah.

The story of Jonah the prophet might resemble the story of many of us in our own relationships with God. Very often we think that we know better, or we just do not want the same thing God wants, or we simply want what we want even though we know God wants something else, even something better. We can know in our hearts that God's way is ultimately the right, the best, and the most beautiful way. Nevertheless, we resist.

God asked Jonah to speak to the heart of the people of Nineveh to turn them from their sinful ways and repent. In repenting, they opened their hearts to God and received life, true life. Jonah refused for two major reasons: First, the Ninevites were the enemies of Israel and Jonah did not want God to save them; and secondly, Jonah was afraid that he would look foolish both preaching in the first place, and, if the people did repent and God did not destroy them, he would look foolish because his prophecy would seem to have failed. Of course, Jonah's mission was to save the people of Ninevah, and so he did not fail, he succeeded.

We can have all kinds of reasons for being reluctant to cooperate with God and allow God to speak to our hearts and direct our lives. It is true that God asks a lot. He asks husbands to love their wives with a love that forsakes all others and all other things. He asks wives to live a life that is given over completely to the love of their husbands. He asks married people to bring children into the world as a sign of their love and to shower love on their children without reserve. He asks children to respect and care for their parents. He asks bishops and priests to be faithful shepherds caring for the flocks and even be willing to lay down their lives for the sheep. He asks all of us to help lighten the load and help carry each other's burdens. He asks Christians to change the world into the Kingdom of God. No easy tasks in a world that resembles Nineveh.

We can have all kinds of reasons to be reluctant to embrace God and His will for our lives. However, God asks us to be courageous, like Daniel who entered the lion's den and tamed the lion, like Jonah who entered Nineveh and converted the whole city, like Peter going into Rome to strengthen the Christians and give his life for Christ. God asks us to be courageous and make a difference in our hearts, homes, Church, community, nation, and world. It was only when Jonah had the courage to stop running and embraced his mission, even though reluctantly, that miracles happened.



Thank you and Happy New Year from St. Vincent de Paul, St. Dominic Conference. 2023 was a year of rising challenges to meet the increased needs of our neighbors. We are extremely grateful for all your support this past year – your prayers, your food donations, and your financial contributions! Our Conference members (Vincents) were busy; we were able to offer support to many neighbors in need. In October/November/December we made 162 home/phone visits, which assisted 444 people. Our top three expenses during this time frame were – rent \$9,251.50, utilities \$8,080.58 and food \$3,054.51. We also offered other assistance – budgeting advice, local food pantry information, resource connections (government agencies, library resources, etc.). So, you can see, we really rely on your support!
