Advent is upon us! We are in preparation for the great feast of Christmas as we remember that Jesus Christ is coming again in glory! Signs of Advent here at St. Dominic are the Advent wreath, the liturgical readings about John the Baptist and from the prophet Isaiah, the liturgical songs, the purple banners in the Gathering Place and the purple vestments at Mass. We also know it is Advent because the Giving Trees have been out. We will be gathering the gifts on the weekend of December 10 and 11 this year, the third Sunday of Advent.

Please join us on Tuesday evening, December 13, for an hour of Adoration in church. Fr. Chris and I will be hearing Confessions during that time, from 7:00-8:00 p.m.

Mike Davis will provide an inspirational Advent evening of prayer and music on Tuesday evening, December 6, at 7:00 p.m. in church.

All our Christmas Masses will be livestreamed! We will begin our celebration of Christmas on Christmas Eve with Masses at 3:00 p.m., 5:00 p.m., and 10:00 p.m. The White and Klug families will again provide the music at the 3:00 p.m. Mass. The 5:00 p.m. Mass will be a school family Mass. Our final Christmas Eve Mass is at 10:00 p.m., with carols by our choir beginning at 9:30 p.m. Christmas Day Masses are at 7:30 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m. There will be no 7:00 p.m. Mass on Christmas and no 7:00 p.m. Mass on New Year's Day, the Feast of Mary, the Mother of God.

We have no idea of what 2023 will bring! Beginning the new year, this prayer of St. Teresa of Avila might be of help. "Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing frighten you. All things are passing. God never changes. Patience obtains all things. Whoever has God lacks nothing. God alone is enough!"

Family Of Parishes

Earlier this year, we introduced you to the priests that will be ministering to our family of parishes. We would also like to share with you over the next couple months a little history about the five parishes that make up our Family of Parishes.

OUR LADY OF VICTORY PARISH

February, 1834 – The Roman Catholic Society of Delhi Township was formed when the Catholics of Delhi gathered at Philip Owen's house. In August 1843, Adam Emge deeded land on Rapid Run to the church and donated the lumber to build the first church and school. Fr. John Martin-Henni was assigned as the priest for St. Stephen Church; twelve children attended school in church to learn German, religion, arithmetic, reading and writing. In 1852, the church was disassembled and moved to land donated by Blaise Schwietzer and Johann Gerteisen on Neeb Road, and the church was reassembled. In

1853, the cornerstone for the first brick church was laid, the new church was named "*Maria Zum Siege*," German for Our Lady of Victory. In 1871, land behind the church was dedicated for a cemetery. The first brick school building was built in 1899. (This school remains on the property. It is the back half of the library building.) In March of 1908, the wrecking of the church built in 1853 began and was completed on October 23, 1908. The building of the new school began in April 1959. In 1962, a convent was built for the Sisters of St. Francis. This building is now used as the Parish Office. In 1972, the 1908 church was evacuated, and all Masses were celebrated in the East Wing of the school building. The church built in 1908 was demolished in 1977. The first Mass in the new church was held on March 23, 1980. In 2002, the Convocation Center was built. In 2016, the inside of the church was renovated to include a center aisle, new tiled floor design, a permanent baptismal area, and a large choir section.

Fr. Benedict O'Cinnsealaigh was named pastor in July 2018. Our Lady of Victory has 1,100 families registered and 477 children attending Our Lady of Victory School. Victory has a vibrant and varied life and is fortunate to have many engaged and involved parishioners who move Victory forward. They make Victory a great community and a lovely Catholic presence on the west side of Cincinnati.

The 8 x 8 pavers allow up to 6 lines with 13 characters per line and cost \$75.00.



Another Way to Support St. Dominic
