# **Eulogy for Frank Thesing**

Thank you for coming. I am Frank's youngest daughter Lynn. Frank was a joyful, strong, peaceful man. A one of a kind that can't be captured in words...but here goes anyway!

A few years ago, I had the privilege of taking my dad on an honor flight. He told me stories about his service, stationed at the Berlin Wall. Although I always knew he was a supply clerk, I didn't know that involved ACTUALLY getting the supplies.

One day, he had an Army convoy following him and was driving a full gasoline tanker. The town he had to drive through to get to the wall was engulfed in flames. After some discussion with his commander, the Sergeant informed him that the rest of the convoy would stay behind but they needed the gasoline at the wall. He would have to move forward through the flames.

He thought of his mom and siblings. He was the oldest of seven. I knew he meant he wanted to act honorably. Then he thought of the Blessed Virgin Mary, said prayers to her and drove as fast as he could. He couldn't see anything through the black, thick smoke fire except a small quarter sized patch of blue sky that guided him the entire time, I remember how he put his hands up like this as he told the story. He followed the blue patch for what seemed like hours, but he recollected that it was probably just 10 minutes or so. Continuing to pray, he made it to his destination safely.

I said, "Dad, you are almost 80 years old, how come you never told us that story?" He said, "Because when you are going through hell you drive as fast as you can, and when you get through it you don't look back. Then you take that little blue spot and make it your life."

He certainly did that. He met my mom 59 years ago and married her almost 57 years ago. In good times and in bad they danced in the kitchen, prayed together, stayed committed and had a symbiotic relationship, a love with God in the center. I want to thank my mom for being his life. He then had three daughters, Maribeth, Lori and I and as well as seven grandchildren. He has spent his last 21 years giving back to the residents of West Park Retirement Home, dancing with them and singing through the hallways. I remember when my Aunt Dot was a resident there, she said, "When your dad enters this place, he walks on water."

All of our lives, people would stop my sisters and I and say, "You have the best Dad." We always knew it.

He definitely wanted us to live life, and sometimes he pushed us right into it. He helped my sister buy a stick shift car and then without lessons had her drive it home. Once we received our temporary driver's license, all of us went from practicing in the school lot to driving on the highway on the same day. "No time like the present!" he'd say. If you complained, he'd remind you "Life isn't fair" and you'd move on. When I tried to get away with something in high school, "You can't kid a kidder Lynner." He always knew what was up, and how to connect to each of us.

He had a way of telling his grandkids words of wisdom and sticking a cuss word in the center of the statement...just to make sure he had their attention. We could tell you a few stories from the golf course...but probably not from the church podium!

The grandkids and close family have been saying so much about him these last few days and we tried to capture it...

"Grandpa radiates joy."..."He would do anything for anyone."..."Grandpa could change your life in a short car ride."..."Grandpa meant everything to me. He was my hero!"..."Grandpa always made me smile."..."He sang as loud as he could, two words ahead of the priest and sometimes they weren't even the right words."... "The most ideal role model."..."He was the best. And gave the best."..."One of God's lights, everyone was drawn to him."..."He was such a gift at West Park...it made me proud."..."He sees the absolute good in everyone."..."Everybody loves Frank."...He was who he prayed to be. As my mom always said, "God gave her the best!"

After the honor flight, I thought his special way must be the perseverance of that young man, but I was only half right.

Over the last few weeks, we have all – mainly the grandkids – been reading grandpa's prayers to him daily. It is a stack of prayers that he collected over his life. It sometimes seemed that it took multiple people many hours to finish these prayers that he prayed every day for the last 10 years in combination with daily mass and holy communion.

I recently came upon the definition of prayer. Prayer is an expression of thank addressed to God. My dad's actions, his intentions, his life was a prayer. That is what made the room light up and the hugs so warm. He was an expression of thanks addressed to God.


Today we remember him, but tomorrow we honor him by capturing his light and taking that blue patch and making this world a better place.

	Amen.	


# Parish Center Rooms and O'Connor Hall
