Sacrament of Matrimony

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

Please call the Parish Office to request this service.




A PERFECT GIFT

ST. DOMINIC ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

Because of COVID-19, the St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul is continuing to have telephone conference meetings every other week. Also, rather than conducting in-home visits and interviews, our process now is to conduct all our interviews on the phone. When we deliver food to our neighbors, we wear our masks and put the food on our neighbors' porches and have a distant chat.

Once again, COVID-19 has NOT slowed down the generosity of the members of St. Dominic parish or the needs of our neighbors. You have been amazingly generous. St. Dominic's St. Vincent de Paul total receipts for the first quarter of 2021 were \$13,711.41 from the poor box collections, the parishioner donations, the schoolchildren, and the member donations.

For the time period of January 1, 2021 until March 31, 2021, St. Dominic's St. Vincent de Paul provided \$16,749.57 in aid to 54 of our neighborhood families made up of 139 adults and children. This includes over \$1,600.00 of Kroger gift cards for families in need.

MAJOR AWARD AND PULLED PORK DRIVE-THRU DINNER


