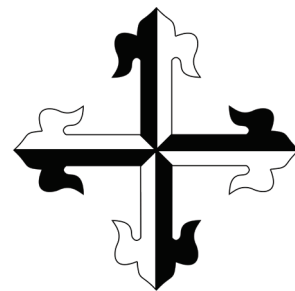

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

We must find time to stop and thank the people who make a difference in our lives."

– John F. Kennedy

A few years before he died, Archbishop Pilarczyk (God rest his soul), designated the theme of "Gratitude" as the spiritual focus for the year. I remember thinking to myself, in my typical arrogant way, "now that's lame." Now, of course, I think to myself, "I'm lame" for thinking *gratitude* was a lame theme. You see, when you are younger, you think that courage, bravery, adventure, are the important things. When you are older, and hopefully wiser, you realize that all those things are around you always, and often to be found where you don't expect to find them in the people who you take for granted.

Even Piglet, one of the characters in A. A. Milne's children's stories about "Winnie-the-Pooh," was astute enough to recognize how important gratitude is: "Piglet noticed that even though he had a very small heart, it could hold a rather large amount of gratitude." I have a doctorate in theology, and I had to learn this from a Piglet!

There is a young server in one of our parishes and whenever he serves at the Mass, and I'm privileged to celebrate, he always has a cheerful disposition, and he always says to me: "Father, thanks for all you do for us." Almost every time, and he's only about 10 or 11 years old. Every time I hear him say, it his words warm my heart and bring a smile to my face. What a generous little chap he is and what a great disposition of gratitude he has. His generosity is a sign of his great heart and there's nothing lame about that.

The thirteenth century Dominican mystic and theologian, Meister Eckhart, thought that gratitude was so important he said: "If the only prayer you said in your whole life was, 'thank you,' that would suffice." Gratitude, he thought, was that important. And Mark Twain said that: "Kindness is the language which the deaf hear and the blind can see."

So, this is a time for me to stop and thank you, the people, who have made a difference in so many lives. Every day I see amazing things happening around me. Ordinary men and women being great parents. They are a witness to lives lived for others. I see "poor" people bringing food items to the churches for poorer people. How generous it is that they give from their need not from their abundance. Children, collecting coats, scarves, gloves, and clothing for the homeless and donating toys for children in need. Others form our youth, and through RCIA, lead souls to communion with God and His Church. People create beauty in our churches and grounds to lift the spirit and soul.

In our parishes, the wise share their knowledge for the sake of the Church's mission and the good of the communities. In our schools and PSR, teachers fill minds and hearts and form character and sow faith. Parishioners serve at the altar and the liturgy while communities offer worship and honor God and pray for others. They clean churches, make Baptism blankets, sponsor candidates, maintain prayer chains, comfort the bereaved, bring Holy Communion to the sick and homebound, sing and serve. Coaches spend their time and talents training individuals to be teams.

As well as all of this, people provide the treasure, their treasure, to make sure that the mission Jesus has given to all of us is kept alive and is made

present in our lives, our communities, our nation and our world. To all those who give so generously, time, talent, and treasure. Thank you for all you do. We give thanks to God for His graciousness in providing for all of us and we give thanks to God for giving us all of you who make all the good that is done possible. Thank you for making a difference in so many lives over so many generations. There’s nothing lame about being grateful. ✚

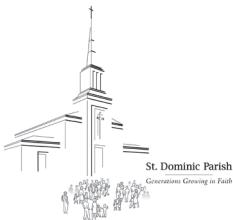

In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, CEF-SGO provides financial-need-based scholarships to students in grades K-12 within the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

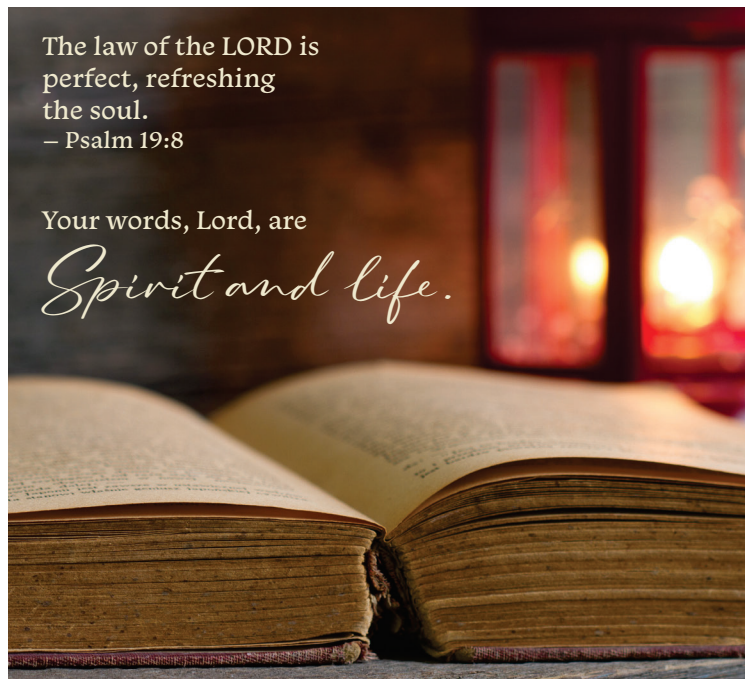
