

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

"IRISH HE IS" by Father Ed Feeney (1897-1978)

A strange blend of shyness, Of pride and conceit, And stubborn refusal To bow in defeat. He's spoiling and ready To argue and fight, Yet the smile of a child Fills his soul with delight. He's wild and he's gentle, He's good and he's bad. He's proud and he's humble, He's happy and sad. In love with the ocean, The earth and the skies, Enamored with beauty Wherever it lies. He's victor and victim, A star and a clod, But mostly he's Irish... In love with his God.

Couple from St. Dominic Parish invited me to their home for a small reception just before Christmas and during the conversation someone asked the people gathered if they didn't live the life they had lived, what would they have liked to be. When it came to my turn, I had no hesitation in answering, I didn't even have to think about it. "A plumber. I always wanted to be a plumber."

As we begin a new year, we often think about where we have come from and where we are going or hope to go. We look back and we look ahead, we take stock, and we plan. We have regrets, hopes, and dreams, but we move forward one way or another.

When I was young, my vision for my life was very different to the life I have lived. I thought I would marry, have kids, work as a plumber, and live my life in Dublin, near my parents, brothers, sisters, nieces, and nephews. I would support the local sports teams and just enjoy the life, Ireland, family, friends, and God, had to offer.

As things turned out, God asked me to be a priest. I didn't really want to do that, but God being God, that's what I did. So, I thought I would become a monk (a type of priest), live my life in a community, work on a farm, avoid people, and die anonymously, buried secretly, with someone playing "outlawed tunes on outlawed pipes." I didn't want to leave Ireland, or Dublin, so God sent me to the USA, and Ohio, and Cincinnati initially to study. But God then said I want you to stay here and be parish priest. I didn't have the gifts for that, and I didn't want to do that, but that's what happened. I was happy living in a parish surrounded by good priests and people. So, God had Bishop Moeddel call me and say: "I want you to go to teach at the seminary." I said I didn't want to do that, so I was appointed anyway. Archbishop Schnurr called me a few years later and said I want you to be the rector of the seminary. I said I really didn't want to do that, and he appointed me anyway. When my term was up as rector, I said I would be happy to just stay on and teach full time. So, Archbishop Schnurr appointed me to OLV as the parish priest. From the parishes that were listed open, I chose Victory because it was a single parish, self-contained, with a school, and it reminded me of the type of people I grew up with in Dublin, salt of the earth, good, not too pious. Then God said that was too comfortable, so he gave me four more parishes and another school. Now, all I want is to be is a hermit. I'm afraid to tell God that because who knows what I will end up doing! The moral of this story: Don't tell God anything!

FR. BEN'S COLUMN (cont'd.)

Except for the last line, all the above is true, mostly! My life is not what I planned. It is better than I planned. God did that! The truth is that no matter where I am, who I'm with, what's going on in life, or who is in my life, I'm still called to the same thing, the same work, the same life. I'm called by God to be a shepherd to the people I'm with, to be a light in the darkness, to bring life, hope, and even joy and happiness, if I can. I was sent to make God present in the world and in the lives of those around me. A priest does not get to choose his mission; in obedience, he accepts. This keeps him from becoming selfish and self-centered. St. Damien of Molokai wrote in a letter home to his mother in Belgium: "Wherever I am and whoever I'm with, if I'm doing God's work, I will be happy."

I'm sure that this is true for all of us. The life we have may not be the life we would have chosen, dreamed of, hoped for, but it is the life we have. Things might be up or down, easy or hard, bleak or bright, better or worse. We don't get to choose our children, but they are our children. We have struggles we didn't foresee and challenges we could not prepare for. No matter, the mission remains the same, we are sent by God to be light, hope, life, joy, grace, wherever we are and to the people we are with.

"THE CHURCH'S RESPONSE TO RACISM"

A lecture by the Most Reverend Shelton J. Fabre, Archbishop of Louisville. February 12 at 7:30 p.m. in the Bartlett Center at Mount St. Mary's Seminary & School of Theology (6616 Beechmont Avenue, Cincinnati, Ohio 45230). It is free and open to the public. Racism is a sin and an evil which continues to manifest in our communities and Church today. As disciples of Jesus Christ, it is imperative that we confront the root causes of racism and its resulting injustices. In his lecture, Archbishop Fabre will present several ways in which the Church is responding to racism and will convey ways to overcome the sin and evil of racism.

SIGNS

Reflection on John 2:1-11

The story of the wedding feast at Cana is called by John the Evangelist to be the first of Jesus' "signs." Mostly we get fixated on this sign as a miracle of changing water into wine, but with Jesus, this is much more than a one-time miracle. It is a sign announcing that something new, even radically new, is happening.

There is a kind of living parable being enacted in this sign. The abundance, indeed extravagance, of 600 liters of wine (what wedding needs that much vino?), provided by Jesus is an acting out of what He proclaimed at the beginning of His mission: "Now is the time of fulfillment! The Kingdom of God is at hand!" Jesus took what little the waiters had on hand (six stone water jars), and transformed it into an overabundance of the wine of joy and celebration. This is reminiscent of a later "sign" where Jesus takes a few loaves and a few fish and feeds a multitude.

This is how God's Kingdom works. What little each of us can provide – our gifts and charisms – when given in love to Jesus and His Body, the Church, a transformation takes place: God multiplies everything by His grace! When living in the reality of God's Kingdom, expect an overflowing, an abundance!
