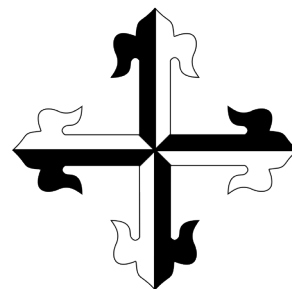

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

In time, you envy less as you appreciate more

It is not unusual for people to envy others what they think they have or even to covet (desire) what others possess. When I was a child, it always seemed to me that our neighbors had more than my family and their lives seemed to be a little easier. As well as a mother and father, there were three kids, while we had a mother and father and five kids, three angelic boys, and then two identical twin girls. Five kids weren't a lot, but it made life tight, and my father and mother had to make sure they stretched every pound (dollar). Life was comfortable, simple, sparing, and we made do with what we had. I have to say, we were a happy family, and we had great parents. We also had a large extended family of grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins, all of which were close and tight-knit. Nevertheless, when you are young, you can tend to envy what you think others have that you don't seem to have, you long for a little more, and for life to be a little easier. Sometimes, we never overcome these feelings, and we can forget to count the blessings we have and the gifts we have received.

I mention that because in the Gospel today Jesus warns His hearers not to lead any "little one astray." A few years ago, I realized that I wouldn't change my family for all the world or for all the treasures in the world. I realized how fortunate I was to have grown up with parents who struggled to keep it all together, who worked hard, but who were always present, always there, always involved and engaged in our lives. In the eyes of the world, we didn't have anything, and even from time to time we may have felt that, but, in reality, we lived a graced and joyful life. It wasn't without struggle, sacrifice, pain, and hardship, but of all the treasures we could have had, we had the most important. We had parents who loved us and who lived for us and who enjoyed sharing in our lives, even if at times, they didn't understand us. Today, I realize how truly lucky we were, how rich we were, and how fortunate we were. Today, I don't envy others, I don't covet what they have. I'm grateful to God because my parents responded to His call and they were not just good parents, they were the best of parents. Funny, my brothers and sisters have turned out to be just like them.

"Don't lead one of these little ones astray." All life begins in the desire of God. Long before God created us, He knew us, He loved us, and He planned for us to come into being. Then, God sent His child, this little boy, or this little girl, not just into the world, no, He sent them to parents. He didn't send them to just any parents, no, He sent them to this mother and this father. No other man will be your child's father, no other woman will be your child's mother. You are it. That God sent His most precious treasure to you shows that He has confidence that you can be the mother/woman, father/man that your child needs. God has confidence in you, otherwise, things would have been different. Now I am not Pollyanna, I realize that due to our human weakness, our particular situations, our own history and limitations, that life can be messy, and things may not turn out as they should or could, or as we would like them to be. Sometimes, God asks others to take over the mantle of father or mother, brother or sister.

Nevertheless, God has given us His treasure, your child, who is God's child first and always will be, and God asks you to care for this treasure – do not lead them astray – but be a light that guides their way. Can you do it? Well, God seems to think so, that's why He sent them to you. Will they rebel, go astray, get lost? I have no doubt, but don't despair, sometimes we only appreciate the good when we grow up.

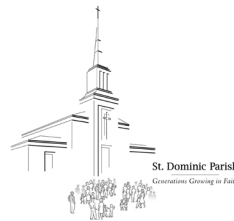
