

FR. BEN'S COLUMN**A God that Gives Himself for His People.**

Every mother knows what it means to provide food for her children. From the moment of conception, a tiny human being is being fed by another human being, a tiny child is being fed, nurtured, and protected by her mother. Even after a child is born, mothers continue to feed their children from their own bodies creating a bond that is eternal.

Jesus says, “I am the bread of life that came down from heaven,” and “This is my body, given up for you, this is my blood poured out for you.” Even more amazingly Jesus says: “My flesh is real food, and my blood is real drink.” At the Last Supper Jesus says: “Take and eat, this is my Body...take and drink, this is my blood.” In the Eucharist we see how absolutely generous Jesus is to us, He gives everything, His whole self, even His Body and Blood, so that we might receive His very life. He is the Bread of Life that gives life. With Jesus there is no holding back, there is no half-measures, there is no reluctance. He loves us absolutely, completely, without reserve, and in doing so He teaches us how to live, how to love, and how to give. After all, what’s the point in half living, partial loving, who wants to receive part of a gift?

The Church is also called the Body of Christ and as such it is called to do what Jesus does and live as Jesus lived. The Church is a Body, a community, a society, that exists, not for itself, but for the sake of others. The Church’s mission is to “go into the world,” to seek the lost, to comfort the sorrowful, to heal the sick, to show compassion to the wayward, to forgive sinners, to gather up God’s children, and to make God’s love present, felt, and available to all. The Church’s mission, like a mother, is to feed and care for God’s children.

All of us are part of this Body of Christ, God’s Church, and so her mission is our mission. We are sent to make God’s love present in the midst of a marriage, a family, a home, a parish, a community, in the midst of the world. God desires to reach out and touch lives through us, His people, who are His Body in the world. Does it matter if we fail to do what God wants? Well, if I don’t do what God has asked me to do – who will do it? Every act of kindness, compassion, charity, hope, tenderness, healing, hope, and love, matters. It matters to the one who receives it; it matters to the one who gives it; it matters to God who sees it.

The celebration of the Eucharist is about the care God has for us. In the desert, for forty years, God fed the people of Israel, His children. Jesus refers to the manna in the desert and says, “I am the new Manna.” He is the Manna that gives eternal life. The Eucharist is all about feeding the hungry soul with the food of life. God invites us to both eat and share that food.

I want to thank all of you who through your prayers, sacrifices, generosity, kindness, in all the work you do, in raising families, in caring for others, in service at our beloved parishes and in building our communities, you make such a difference in so many lives and you make the world a better place. Thanks to all you do to build God’s Kingdom among us.


ST. VINCENT DE PAUL ST. DOMINIC CONFERENCE**Blessed Beyond Measure**

Many have been blessed because of your generosity! A lot of our calls for help are from neighbors living in a pattern of poverty, but we also get calls from folks that simply “fell on hard times.” This could be any of us or our family members.

A few examples:

- A single mom of a 4-month-old infant, two days after she purchased a car, she was involved in a hit-and-run car accident, and her car was totaled. As a result, she couldn't work because she had no car and couldn't afford daycare. We were able to help her with her rent while she worked through insurance and applying for a new job.
- What about the recently divorced mom of five kids whose ex is an alcoholic. She works full time and is taking college courses online. All it took to upset the apple cart was an unexpected car repair bill and unexpected year-end school expenses for her children. We were able to help her with her rent.
- The young couple of two small children have racked up so much debt trying to make ends meet this past year because the 35-year-old mother wasn't able to work because of her cancer diagnosis, surgeries and treatments. We were able to lighten their load by paying two utility bills for them.


