

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

he Irish playwright and poet, Oscar Wilde (fellow Dubliner), wrote: "To live is the rarest thing in the world. Most people exist, that is all."

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord which refers to the manifestation of Jesus to the world represented by The Three Kings. Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." The Gospels paint a truly beautiful and sentimental picture of the birth of the Lord. A miraculous star, angel choirs, shepherds watching over the sheep, the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, sheep, cattle, three wise men (Kings), a humble stable and a lowly donkey. It's the stuff of poetry. And at the center of it all is a small child, a baby, in fact, and that is Jesus. With all the beautiful details, we can be in danger of losing sight of what is being revealed, of what is most important. First, God the Creator of all things, who cannot be held or encompassed by anything He has created, makes Himself a creature, a man, a baby. God, who is pure spirit, or pure being, takes on a created form in flesh – that's what incarnation means, fleshed. Second, God does this because of our need for salvation and, most importantly, and even more astonishingly, because He loves us. This is what is being revealed, manifested, shown forth - God, the uncreated became a creature, and came into the world to save me because *He loves me*.

How should we respond to this love of God? As Wilde observed, many people simply manage to "get through life." Many rarely say what they want to say, do what they want to do, live the life they want to live, or be the people they feel in their hearts they were created to be. Don't get me wrong, I'm not advocating that people simply live as they like in some sort of simple hedonism. To "live" as Wilde suggests, is to realize the full potential of who we are and to overcome the fears that prevent us from being who we are created to be and live the life we are created to live.

The truth is that God created us, and God created us for a purpose. The very reason for being is to be loved by God and to love God. This is our purpose and meaning for being/existing. It is not a simple response to God's love, or two sides of a coin. No! We are created, in our very nature, our very DNA, our very being and our reason for being, is to be loved by God and to love God. When we do this, we will truly know what life is meant to be about, what life truly is, who we truly are. When we live like this we will manifest, or show forth, our true self; that is an epiphany. That is what God does at the Feast of the Epiphany – He shows forth His true self, a God who is willing to become a creature (child) in order to save the children He loves.

The proper response to this love of God is to dare to be who God created us to be and live as He created us to live. When we dare to be who God wants us to be, we are making present in the world a gift from God, we are fulfilling our purpose, we are manifesting something God wants to reveal. That is an epiphany. "To live is the rarest thing in the world. Most people exist, that is all." Life is too short to simply just exist; dare to live – dare to be who God created you to be. St. Irenaeus of Lyons, Bishop of Lyons, writing in 185 said: "Gloria Dei vivens homo." "The glory of God is man fully alive." Don't be afraid to be fully alive; doing so honors God.



LOVE ST. DOMINIC AND WANT AN OHIO TAX CREDIT?

The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) has been certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO). In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, CEF-SGO provides financial-need-based scholarships to students in grades K-12 within the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Supporting students and their formation through Catholic Education is a great way to share our blessings and faith with younger generations. The CEF-SGO may now allow for Catholic Education supporters to be able to receive a tax credit for their generosity. If you would like to donate specifically to St. Dominic School, you can earmark the donation to The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati as "St. Dominic School." Donations can easily be made online at CatholicBestChoice.org/SGO.

Ohio taxpayers who donate to SGOs may be able to claim a dollar-for-dollar, nonrefundable tax credit on their state income tax return for up to \$750.00 per donor (up to \$1,500.00 if married and filing jointly). Please consult with your tax advisor to determine your eligibility for the tax credit, its value to you, and the details of your gift.
