

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can receive this sacrament. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death by calling the parish emergency line. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

CONSIDERING BECOMING CATHOLIC?

RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. The process provides for different levels of entry. To obtain more information, call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. o.

INFANT BAPTISMS

Baptisms are usually held on the first and second Sunday of each month, except during Lent. Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. o.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Be a great spirit in the world.

Why fly like a hen when you can soar like an eagle?

- Saint Padre Pio of Pietrelcina

A few weeks ago, we celebrated the feast of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. John is one of the greatest figures in the Scriptures, even from his mother's womb he was already raising his voice to proclaim that Jesus is the Lamb of God and the Savior of the World. There was no silencing John and there was no way of keeping him from carrying out his mission. John was truly a man of conviction, courage, tenacity, and heart. Brave, honorable, and determined that nothing, and no one, was going to keep him from doing what God sent him to do. Like a great eagle, he soared in a world full of pigeons.

One of the readings for the feast of the nativity of John states: "Hear me, O coastlands, listen, O distant peoples. The Lord called me from birth, from my mother's womb he gave me my name" (Isaiah 49:I). What is true of John is also true of us all. Is there anyone in the world who was not sent by God? Is there anyone who does not have a mission from God that they are called to accomplish? God sent you into the world for a particular purpose, a mission all your own. Do you know what it is? Have you achieved it yet? Or have you allowed the "world" to slow you down, deceive you, to cover you over with its useless stuff? Are you soaring with the eagles or clucking around the barn yard with the hens?

Don't waste your life on the "other things," the petty, the selfish, the mundane and the unimportant. Don't waste your life on being someone other than who God created you to be. Don't waste your time doing something other than what God asks you to do. That truly is a waste of time, a waste of gifts and talents, a waste of resources and, most importantly, a waste of a life. Time spent on the "useless stuff" is time we don't get back.

We live in a world of pigeons, scrambling around for the crumbs that fall to the ground, or like barn yard hens that scratch around the farmyard looking for the scraps. Like John, we are made for greatness, we are made with purpose, and we are sent to achieve great things. John didn't let anything stand in his way. Ask yourself: Have I achieved yet what God sent me into the world to do? If not, you have work to do. Get up and do it! Or as Warren Buffett put it: "If you want to soar like an eagle in life, you can't be flocking with the turkeys."

SAFE PARISH Training due July 24, 2024

Everyone registered with SafeParish should have received a training video. The training bulletin is due on July 24. If you have a bulletin past due, you are not permitted to work/volunteer with children, according to the Archdiocesan policy.

With summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition.

In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish quarterly bulletins.

With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish account is approved. If you did not get the bulletin, check your spam, or junk mail. You can also sign into your account at www.aocsafeenvironment. org. Go to the Training Tab and click on "Due" to see which bulletins are due and their due date.
