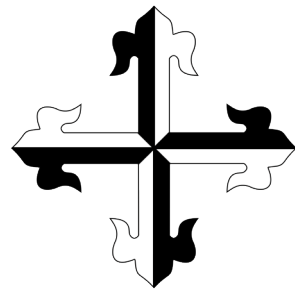

**FR. BEN'S COLUMN**
**Who are the two by two?**

I can remember my grandmother, who we called Nanny (her name was Anne, and my grandfather called her Annie) taking me to Mass at her parish church, St. Joseph Church, East Wall, Dublin. It's a very large church and in those days, it was always crowded for Mass. I must have been very young at the time because I can remember running up and down the side aisle. Then, suddenly stopping, and looking around. Yes, I was one of those children – no surprise there, I guess! For a moment I was lost, I couldn't see my Nanny, and a look of panic must have come over my little face for, just then, an old lady whispered to me and pointed: "There's your Nanny, there." I got back into the pew and didn't move for the rest of the Mass. When St. Joseph Church was built, my father was working in construction in England. At that time, there was massive unemployment in Ireland and many men and women went to Britain to work. After the Second World War, Britain was experiencing a building boom. He told me that he would send money home to his parents and some extra money for the building of the church. My grandfather would send him photos, by mail, of the construction as it was happening. You can see the church tower, with its clock, over the small slate roofs of the houses, from the kitchen of my grandparents' house.

Another of my earliest memories is of my mother pushing me in a stroller to Mass in Finglas, which is a suburb of north Dublin. At that time, the old church had just been pulled down and an enormous new church, maybe twice the size of Our Lady of Victory and St. Dominic, had been built. Two things I remember, and I must have been three or four at the time: First, the old bell tower was still standing, and a single bell was hanging there. Second, when we went into the church, Mass had already begun and I saw the priest standing at the High Altar, intoning the Mass, with his back to the congregation. This is my first memory of hearing Latin.

At this stage you might be asking yourself: "What is Fr. Ben going on about?" Good question! Like most of you, I can trace almost all the important and impressionable events of my early life to occasions with my family and in particular with my parents. Their character, choices, way of life, their values, their temperaments, and so much more, have imprinted themselves in my character, in my heart, on my soul. Of all the people in my life, they have been the most important and have imprinted the deepest impressions. What they have taught me, in what they said, what they did, and who they are, have helped form me into who I am. My parents weren't overly pious or religious, but fortunately, for me, my parents were disciples of Jesus, and because of this, they made the Gospel a reality in my life. They have been the most important teachers in my life. Jesus sent His disciples out "two by two." Surely, Jesus still does this – in parents. He sends you into the lives of your children – "two by two."

As my old professor, Fr. Luke Dempsey OP (God rest his gentle soul), repeated many times: "Gentlemen, the most important things you learn in life you learn sitting at your mothers' knee."

**SAFE PARISH**

**Training due July 24, 2024**

Everyone registered with SafeParish should have received a training video. The training bulletin is due on July 24. If you have a bulletin past due, you are not permitted to work/volunteer with children, according to the Archdiocesan policy. With summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition.

In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish quarterly bulletins.

With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish account is approved. If you did not get the bulletin, check your spam, or junk mail. You can also sign into your account at [www.aocsafeenvironment.org](http://www.aocsafeenvironment.org). Go to the Training Tab and click on "Due" to see which bulletins are due and their due date. 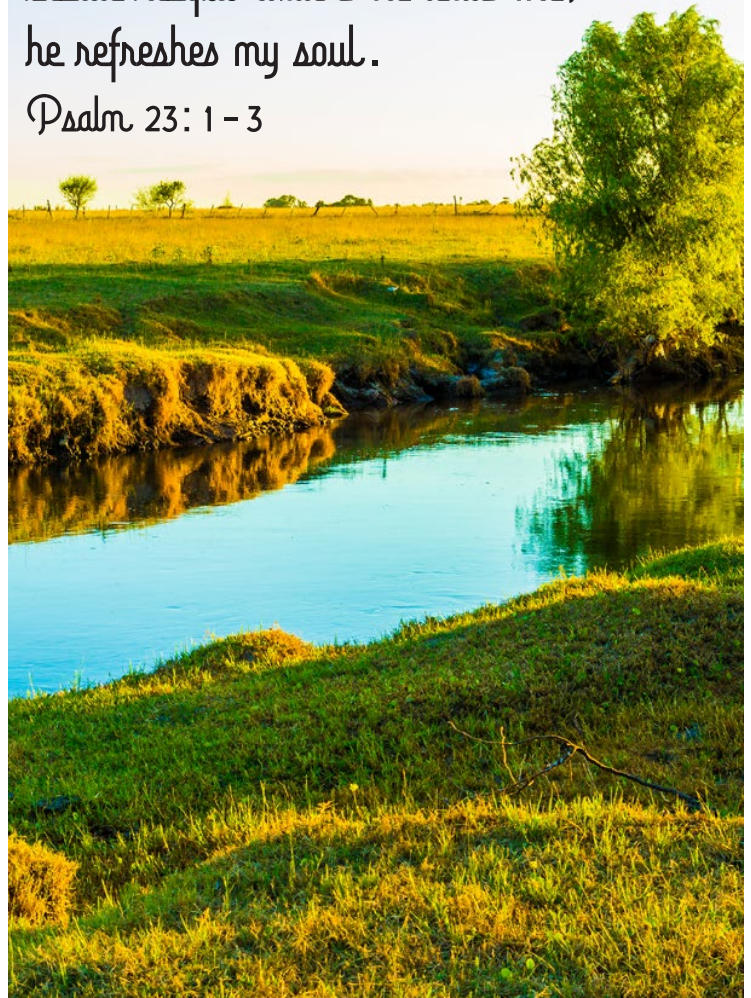
