FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Make a difference for eternity

During my first summer in the United States, I took classes at the University of Dayton during the week and spent the weekends travelling by car to different parishes around the country preaching for the missions – mission preaching. I was in Indiana, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, New York State, and Wisconsin. As we see here at our churches, a preacher makes a presentation, and we give donations to the missions. The preacher is not paid for this mission, all proceeds go to the missions.

For the most part, the priests I met along the way were very kind and hospitable. However, there was one that was a standout experience. I went to an old and poor parish in the Archdiocese of Boston. I arrived on Friday afternoon and was met by the pastor and his dog. "Father, I'm so glad you are here. Welcome to St. Peter's" (not the real name). These were the first words the old priest said as the young golden retriever bounced around. He told me to put my bags down and he would show me the church. When we got to the church the dog sat patiently at the entrance from the sacristy to the church and waited for his master's return. When we got back to the rectory the old man turned to me and said: "Father, I have a big favor to ask of you. My sister, who is even older than I am, has been ill and because I'm the only priest here I have been unable to go and see her. Your being here is an opportunity for me to get away and visit her. Would you mind terribly if I was to leave you here alone and take off. I have food and drink in the fridge, the TV is there, and you have your own room and here are the keys to the house and church. Someone will be in to set up for Mass on Saturday and Sunday." I was delighted to help the old man out, so I said, "Please Father, you go, take care of your sister." With that, he and the dog went off to care for someone in need.

After the last Mass on Sunday the old priest was waiting in the sacristy as I came off the altar. He was overjoyed to have seen his sister. I got my bag, and he walked me to my car. The pastor said to me "Now Father, the collection will be sent to the mission office, and we will take care of that." Then he handed me an envelope and said: "But Father, this is for you personally. It is not for the missions. It is for you. We can't thank you enough for taking the time and coming to be with us and for allowing me to visit with my elderly sister. God bless you, Father." And with that we said goodbye. I drove from Boston to Dayton that afternoon. When I got "home" I opened the envelope that old man had given me to find a substantial gift and a kind thank you note.

The kindness of that old man made such an impression upon me that I made a vow to do the same thing for visiting priests when I had the opportunity. Also, my first dog in the States was a golden retriever. Strange how impressions have lasting effects. The impression that this old priest's kindness, generosity, and compassion along with his obvious love for the priesthood and his family and people made such an impact on me that it is like a treasure he has passed on. His goodness moved me. The financial gift is long gone but the impression will be with me as long as I live and if I have an impact on others, it will live for eternity and because of it – this old priest will live for eternity with God. Now that is a treasure worth having.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN CONTINUED

The crowd in today's Gospel story ask: "What must we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus tells them that believing in Him and building His Kingdom is doing the works of God. Investing in eternal things is the only investment worth making if we want to have eternal happiness.

What will be your lasting legacy? Surely not the things of this world! We cannot take the things of this world with us, and eventually all the things of this world will pass away. In the end even gold, silver and diamonds will be melted away and will explode into a billion pieces of dust. All that will last will be the things that God treasures in His heart. And what God treasures is us, the love we shared, and the good we have done for others.

SAFE PARISH

Everyone registered with SafeParish should have received a training video. The training bulletin was due on July 24. If you have a bulletin past due, you are not permitted to work/ volunteer with children, according to the Archdiocesan policy.

With summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition.

In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish quarterly bulletins.

With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure you are up-to-date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish account is approved. If you did not get the bulletin, check your spam, or junk mail. You can also sign into your account at www.aocsafeenvironment.org. Go to the Training Tab and click on the "Due" like to see which bulletins are due and their due date.
