#### FR. BEN'S COLUMN

#### What do servants look like?

ne morning just before Mass, I had an opportunity to chat with the first grade kids. The conversation started with one little boy telling me he lost a tooth. I asked him if the Easter Bunny gave him anything for his tooth and he told me that it wasn't the Easter Bunny but the Tooth Fairy who comes and collects teeth. As it turned out he got \$20.00 for his tooth. I wish I had that Tooth Fairy when I was a child. This led into a conversation about losing teeth and it was interesting how some of the children mistook the Tooth Fairy for Tinkerbell. I don't know for certain, but I'm pretty sure that they are two different fairies. Once Tinkerbell was mentioned that led into a conversation about "The Wonderful World of Disney." One child told me that she had been to Disney World, Disneyland, and a Disney Cruise. I have actually been to both Disneyland and Disney World. I was in Disneyland when I went to visit friends in California because that's one of the things you do as a tourist when you are in LA LA land. I was in Disney World in Florida about twenty-five years ago when my parents, brothers, sisters, their children, and a cousin and her children all staved for ten days on Coco Beach and traveled to Orlando in three family vans.

I have to tell you that I have no plans to ever go back to anything with the name Disney in it. It was torturous, I thought I would never get out and when I did, I thought my spirit would be crushed for life. Have you ever been anywhere more syrupy-sweet, and candy flossed in your life? And here is my point (at last), every child there was excited, joyful, happy, and in their own world. Of course, they were accompanied by parents, many of whom were at their wits end trying to corral them. I'm thinking of that and how being willing to take your children to the Magic Kingdom must be a true expression of how much these parents love their children. Not just that they have to fork out a fortune to a Mouse for the privilege of going to his pad, but you have to pay extra to shake hands with the rodent. Then they have to endure hours of complete agony visiting every ride and exhibit, and they do so, because they want to give their children something special, they want to see them smile, they want them to enjoy life, they want them to be happy. Parents are willing to make sacrifices for the well-being and happiness of their children.

Sacrifice is not uncommon to parents; in fact, sacrifice is a way of life for most moms and dads. Once a child comes into their lives, their lives change forever. Now there is a different reason to live, a different reason to get up in the morning, a different reason to spend the day at work, a different way to spend our earnings, our time, our energy and our life. And in spite of the sacrifices they have to make, they don't see this life as a sacrifice, they see it as a blessing, a joy, a gift, an enrichment. Parents give, and give, and give more again, and it is never a burden, and it never ends, it is always willingly given and without expectation of return. Only the love of a parent would endure the pain and martyrdom of Disney for their child.

If you want to see the sort of leadership Jesus is speaking about in the Gospel today, I think good parents are a good model of what He wants us to be and to do. Jesus said, "I came to serve, not to be served." I think every good mom and dad knows what that means and knows what that looks like. They serve, they are not served, and they do so with love and because of love. A mother's, or a father's, love for their child is a good example of what Jesus means by service.






