One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

AN INVITATION TO BELONG.

remember my mother telling me that it wasn't polite to talk about politics or religion at the table. This was because these two issues can so often be divisive and lead to tension, arguments, hard feelings and more. Nevertheless, as passionate as we can be on these issues, and as divisive as they can be in families, the family is usually bigger than these issues. After all, we might disagree, but we are still family – the family is more than any one issue and so there are ways of remaining engaged and involved even when we disagree and even fight passionately.

Having lived in families, all of us realize that there is no such thing as a perfect family. Families are made up of all sorts of people, personalities, temperaments, abilities, and talents. There are those who are great successes, those who go from crisis to crisis, those who never manage to take off, and those who can't wait to spread their wings and fly away, never to be seen or heard of again. Most of us struggle and manage to keep body and soul together and do our best as parents, siblings, off-spring, spouses, people and even priests and pastors. Families are made up of all sorts and families are as diverse as people.

Large or small families, those who belong to a family generally try to do the best for each other. We try to be good parents, good brothers and sisters, good sons and daughters, aunts and uncles, good priests. When one is hurt the rest of us feel the pain and want to help in the healing. When one goes astray the rest of us try to help them find their direction again. When one is lost, we all search in an attempt to bring them home to the safety of the family.

Together Sunday.

This year, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is encouraging parishes to celebrate *Together Sunday* as an invitation and a celebration. It is an invitation to welcome all our people, the engaged, the fallen away, the alienated, and even our friends and families, to come and participate in the Eucharist and our community. This initiative, which will take place on November 24, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, offers an ideal rallying point for reigniting worship together as a community and offering an invitation to belong. It is a celebration that we belong *Together* and we help each other. It is an opportunity to engage in ministry, parish life, and community support. We belong together, together we are stronger, together we can achieve anything.

We don't get to choose; we are given a gift.

If I was to ask you which child, would you be willing to give up or give away, or which brother or sister do you want to see go to another family, which one would you choose? I can't imagine life without my brothers and sisters. They drive me crazy; they get under my skin, they know all the buttons to push, and they really love to make fun of me. We don't agree on everything, we fight like cats and dogs, we are very different. But I am so fortunate that I grew up with them and that they are my family. And now their kids – just as awful as their parents, but they're mine, my nieces, my nephews, my family. I can't live without them, and I don't want to. Every one of them is unique and

they have their own gifts and talents, personalities, quirks, and characters. Everyone brings something unique, and we would not be who we are without each of them, we would not be a complete family. Together, we are family.

"Who is my mother and brothers?" You are my family.

No family is perfect. In fact, no individuals are perfect. We don't even claim that Saints are perfect, only that they are heroically holy. Only Jesus and Mary were perfect. I don't know about you but I'm OK with not being perfect. I strive for goodness and to be honest, that takes all my energy.

God created us to be part of His family and Jesus extends that same invitation, on behalf of God, to all the world: "Go into the whole world and invite everyone to belong." When asked who His family was Jesus said, "Those who want to belong to the Father are my family." God sent Jesus into the world to restore what was broken, to find the lost, to bind the wounded, and to feed the hungry. That's us! That's all of us! Imperfect, broken, sinners, limping, and hungry, we are invited to belong, to come together, to be together, to form a community of the broken who help each other. Personally, I think that's a great community to belong to. That's a community I can belong to.

The Church is not a community of the perfect. Although it includes the perfect, it is a community of sinners. More than that, the Church exists for the sake of the sinners, the lost, the hungry. The Church exists for sinners, like us, so let's not be surprised when we find sinners in the Church. God does not want to give away any of His children. He searches for you, He wants you, you are important to Him, you are His treasure. And, further, the Church is not complete without you. You are that important!

another, each individual, each child, each member. Together we are a family - not perfect - but we love each other and

that, my friends, makes all the difference.

To my brothers and sisters who belong to our community of faith, thank you for coming together and making this a great place to be, a shining light, a caring community. For those who have been away, like us, you may not be perfect, but that does not mean you don't belong. In fact, that is an indication that you truly belong, for the Church exists for you, Christ came for you, because God loves you. Without you we are incomplete. Without you the body is missing a vital part of who we should be. We want you back, we want you with us, we want you here. "Individually, we are a drop. Together, we are an ocean." All families have issues, all families are imperfect, but they are still family. Come home. Please!


GIVING TREES November: A Time for **Giving Thanks**
