

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can receive this sacrament. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death by calling the parish emergency line. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

CONSIDERING BECOMING CATHOLIC?

RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. The process provides for different levels of entry. To obtain more information, call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. o.

INFANT BAPTISMS

Baptisms are usually held on the first and second Sunday of each month, except during Lent. Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. o.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN



EVERYONE IS A GIFT

oon it will be Christmas, and we will be surrounded by all the wonderful comforts of that special time of the year. For most of us, family will be home, kids returning from college, cards from all over the world, fairy lights, Christmas trees, snow men and spying the elf on the shelf, and the family fight at Christmas dinner. People will greet each other and share a smile, presents will be placed under the tree, and food will be abundant.

I will hear one of my favorite songs, the *Little Drummer Boy*, which liturgists tell us should not/or cannot be played in church. I pay as much attention to liturgists as I do to bishops, so we love that song here in our family of parishes. It's not certain who wrote the song, but it is believed to have been written by Katherine K. Davis in 1941, although others say either Henry Onorati or Harry Simeone are the authors. It is based on an old Czech carol.

The point is, the little drummer boy was a child that went to visit the Virgin Mary and her newborn Son at the manger. As others gave their gifts, he sadly said to Mary, "I am a poor boy, too, I have no gift to give that is fit for a king." Then the little boy asked if he should play for the baby and Mary nodded. The little boy played, and the little child Jesus smiled at him. Oh! What a gift that was to the little drummer boy. Imagine, Jesus smiling at you!

A few weeks ago, at Mass I told the story about a baby of a friend of mine who was born in Ireland without thumbs. Many people said how would he manage without thumbs? From the first day she took him home, the child's mother exercised his fingers. When he was able to grasp and hold things, she put pencils, pens, crayons, paintbrushes, knives, forks, spoons, in his hands until he managed to use them. That child loved art and now has a career as a graphic artist. He, and his mother, didn't let his apparent limitations hold him back. Our gifts are limited only by our own lack of adventure.

In our archdiocese, we are celebrating what is being called "Together Sunday." It is an invitation to belong, it is an invitation to join the community, and it is an invitation to share what we have with each other. All of us are a gift and all of us have gifts. Pablo Picasso said: "The meaning of life is to find your gift. The purpose of life is to give it away." This is an invitation to share your gift of yourself with this community by belonging. It is also an invitation to share your gifts with this community so we can enjoy and celebrate all the gifts God wants us to have. It is also an invitation to see each other as a gift, a gift from God. You and your gifts enrich this community and bring a smile to the face of the Lord. Don't be limited by your own doubts, jump in and make some noise.

FROM FR. JIM

Last weekend, there was a memorial tribute to Pete Rose at Great American Ball Park. His death has been an invitation to reflect on my memories of competing against him growing up. My earliest memory of him was a Pee Wee football game at Bold Face Park, watching our St. William defensive backs chasing Pete from behind as he ran for a touchdown. I have many memories of playing against him in Knothole baseball. One play stands out for me in B Knothole. I was playing shortstop and Pete tried to steal second. We had him dead to right, and he tried unsuccessfully to run me over. I recalled that play when he won the All-Star game by running over catcher Ray Fosse. Pete was a very smart player, always looking for an edge. He carried this over into his professional career with the Big Red Machine. I would have loved to have been in on those conversations between Rose, Morgan, and Bench talking about various baseball situations in the dugout. I remember the Elder -West High game on Thanksgiving, my Senior year. West High won that game. The star running back was Pete Rose!

Pete was a catcher all the way through Knothole baseball, but when he got to high school, he switched to second base because he didn't have a strong enough arm to make it to the big leagues as a catcher. My favorite memory was as a member of Elder's baseball team, beating Pete and Eddie Brinkman and West High, 3 -1 for the city championship in 1959. We played the game at Cheviot field house park. Pete hit a ball off Scotty Seger that hit the light pole in left center. We went on to win the state championship. Pete went on to break Ty Cobb's hit record. One thing you can say about Pete Rose, he was "single minded" in his determination to play major league baseball! Rest in peace, Pete!
