Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN



TOGETHER FOR ALL OUR SAKES

The human brain can be divided into two main types of cells, neurons and glials. The adult human brain is thought to consist of around 86 billion neurons and around the same number of glial cells. Neurons are responsible for receiving sensory information from the external environment and relaying motor commands from the brain to the muscles. Glial cells have a variety of roles in supporting and protecting the functions of the neurons. There are another 3000-plus types of brain cells operating at the same time. There are 36 trillion cells in the human body and 2-3 billion cells in the heart. Individually, cells are so small we can really only view them under a microscope. While some cells can last the span of a human lifetime, many are replaced every seven years.

Only in connecting and working together can cells achieve their real purpose. A human cell on its own cannot fulfill its purpose; it cannot develop its potential, and it cannot survive. But together, these cells are strong; they live, they reproduce, and they give life. Coming together and forming one body, each cell helps achieve something, each cell gives something, each cell does something, each cell has a purpose. Each cell is important and has a task. Although each type of cell is identical, they still produce individuals, and no two individuals are the same.

Together is bigger than we think

Very often, when we think of a parish community, a diocese, or even the Church, we can rightly think of all those whom we see, hear, work with; whom we share our lives with. Together, we are a community, a parish, a family, the Church. We know that the Church is bigger than us here on the westside of Cincinnati, or even the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, or the Church in the United States. The Church is all the people who belong, every nationality, culture, language, color, ethnicity, all people. There are more than one billion Catholics in the world and all together, we are the Church. All belong, all are called, all have a mission, all make a difference, all are important, all are sent, all are a gift from God, and all are brothers and sisters – together, we are the Body of Christ, we are the Church. Together, we are one body.

Pope John XXXIII

As Catholics and Christians, our sense of togetherness is even greater than this world and this time. When he called the Second Vatican Council, Pope John XXIII asked that we remember that the Church is not just made up of those who are living on earth now, but all those who have ever belonged to the Church, all those who will belong, all those who are already in heaven, and all those who are on the way through purification in Purgatory. For us, being "together" is all of us; we are all together, we form one body and we all help each other on the same journey. The Blessed Virgin, the Saints, are as much a part of the Church as we are and they are just as present, just as concerned, just as active. They are involved in our mission. They hear our prayers, and our prayers and sacrifices help others, the living and the dead.

When he was a child, the future Pope John was taken by his parents to a procession of the relics of a saint through the town. Unable to see, his father put him on his shoulders, and he was able to observe everything. Reflecting on this gesture later in life, he said: "The secret in life is to let yourself be carried by others to God. My whole life has been about letting other people carry me to God."




