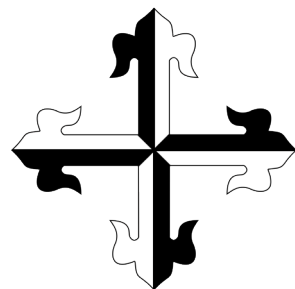

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

MAN OF DREAMS

“A dreamer is one who can only find his way by moonlight, and his punishment is that he sees the dawn before the rest of the world.” – *Oscar Wilde*

St. Joseph is one of the major figures in the Advent Season. He is called “a just man,” which in the Sacred Scripture is a code word for someone who is dedicated to the Lord God and lives according to the Law. Personally, I like to see Joseph as a man of dreams. He’s a man of dreams in a number of ways and dreams guide his life. He is told in a dream not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife, as the child she is expecting is the Son of God. He is warned in a dream to take his wife and the child to Egypt for Herod wants to kill the child. When in Egypt, it is through another dream that St. Joseph is told that Herod is dead, and it is safe to return to Israel. And in a fourth dream, St. Joseph is told not to return to Judea but to go to Nazareth.

There is another sense in which we can call St. Joseph a dreamer and that is because he was a man committed to God. To be a “just man,” you must be willing to commit yourself to great things because God expects and enables great things. Let’s not confuse “great” with “big,” or “major initiatives,” or “colossal works.” The Hoover Dam is a colossal work, an amazing initiative, a great human achievement, but even that began with a dream. A great thing is bringing a child into the world, safeguarding the life of that child in the face of danger. A great thing is spending your life among lepers to bring comfort, healing, and grace like St. Damien did in Molokai. A great thing is bringing food to the pantry to help feed strangers in need. A great deed is healing the sick, clothing the naked, educating children. All of these things we do every day are great things. To be a man/woman of faith, is to be a dreamer, because it is our dreams that give us the vision, to see what we see, to do what we do, to believe what we believe. And it is our dreams that lead us to do both great and small things; the just, the courageous, the brave, and the compassionate.

The great German author and philosopher, Johann Wolfgang von Goethe (d. 1832), said: “Dream no small dreams, for they have no power to move the hearts of men.” This should be especially true for any man, or woman, who has a child or children, and for any man who is a priest. We are required to dream big, because we are called to form hearts, minds, and souls, and we don’t want them to be small, or mean, or selfish. We dream big so that we sow greatness in our children, in our families, in our marriages, in our communities and in our world. Let’s face it, the Angel Gabriel said: “All things are possible with God.” A man of dreams knows this, believes this, and allows God to make such great things real.

Samuel Beckett said: “Ever tried. Ever failed. No matter. Try Again. Fail again. Fail better.” And Mark Twain warned: “Keep away from people who try to belittle your ambitions. Small people always do that, but the really great make you feel that you, too, can become great.”

All men and women are created by God to be great, and all we have to do is: “Don’t be afraid” to dream, dream big, dream and then make it happen. We are only limited by our own self-doubt or by allowing the naysayers to steal away our dreams. We can at least try. Right?

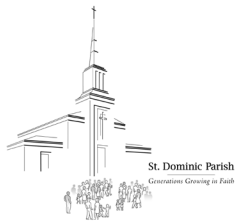

Pavers are the gift that lets your mother, father, grandparent, child, or spouse know how cherished they are. Order forms are available at the doors of church or in the Parish Office. The 4 x 8 bricks allow three lines with 13 characters per line and cost \$40.00. The 8 x 8 pavers allow up to six lines with 13 characters per line and cost \$75.00.
