FR. BEN'S COLUMN

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Tamily stories are very important, and most people love to hear stories about where they came from - their history. We all know that where we came from helped make us who we are. It's important to me to know that my grandfather fought in the Irish Rebellion in 1916 and then in the Irish War of Independence and later the Irish Civil War. My grandmother was a little girl in 1916 living in the inner city of Dublin. When the Easter Rising began, as the British navy and army artillery bombarded the city, she and her family had to take refuge in the cellar of their house. She remembered that as the fighting ended it was the British soldiers who, in an act of kindness, passed their rations down to the children trapped in the cellar. For almost a week, they had nothing to eat and very little water. My other grandmother told of smuggling arms and ammunition into Dublin in the bottom of baby carriages with the babies sitting on top past the British army and police checkpoints. That's my ancestry. I guess rebellion has always run in my blood.

With the advent of companies like "Ancestory.com" and "23 and Me DNA," there has been a growing interest in genealogy. If you think you are related to an "Ancient Alien," well then, the so-called "History Channel" is the place for you. Back in the 1970s, people all over the world were riveted to the TV screens for the weekly episode of the famous drama "Roots." Family and family history is important to us and who we feel we are.

Ancestry was also important for the people who knew and believed in Jesus. At the beginning of St. Matthew's and St. Luke's Gospels, there are genealogies; the line of the ancestors of Jesus from Adam to Mary and Joseph. All the names on these lists tell a story; all the people on these lists played a part in bringing about the birth of God's Son, Jesus. It's a motley crew, with saints and sinners, men and women, kings and shepherds, yet they all played a part in bringing about a miracle.

All these people made a difference. At the time, it may not have seemed like they were important, or that they were successful, but they were essential to God. The same is true for us. We may not see the reason for our being, but that does not mean we don't have a reason for being. Someday, maybe in heaven, we will know why we were here because God will tell us. But be assured, we are here because God wants us here, and God has something for us to do. So, live like life matters – because – for our future generations – it does.

The English Saint, Fr. John Henry Newman put it this way: "God has created me to do Him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good; I shall do His work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it if I do but keep His commandments. Therefore, I will trust Him, whatever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him, in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him. If I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. He does nothing in vain. He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends. He may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide my future from me. Still, He knows what He is about."
