

INFANT BAPTISMS

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

HOLY FAMILY

y father was eighty-seven years old when he died, and he had the mileage to prove it. In his last couple of years, he found it harder and harder to get around. He had to curtail the round trip walk from our house to the pub a couple of times a day. Fortunately for him, old age didn't affect his drinking! Nevertheless, his legs and feet gave him trouble. One evening when I was home a few years ago, I saw my brother Gerard, kneeling on the floor, very tenderly and patiently, changing a bandage on my Da's (Dublin word for Dad) foot. Now Gerard, then was a fifty-four-year-old man, over six feet tall, and a fairly hefty dock/train worker.

The image reminded me of another scene years ago when Gerard was about six. He was running across the street and was hit by a motor bike. Badly injured, he was rushed to Temple Street Children's Hospital. Each evening, after work, my Da would go by the hospital to visit him. For the first few days, Gerard was unconscious, and it was touch and go if he would survive. Da would kneel by the bedside and ask God to spare his son. Basically, the same image, separated by almost fifty years. It was my brother Gerard who sat by the hospital bed when my Da died. Family! Right!

Images like that make an impression on you. I guess that's why God asks parents to lead by example. A shepherd leads the flock, and the flock follows the shepherd. If you want a lesson to stick with a person, teach it to a child, and teach it in the home, and let the parent be the teacher. These are the lessons that make the biggest impression, the lessons that last, the lessons that will impact a child's life, for the whole of their lives.

One of the truly great, and simplest lines in the Gospels, is found in the Gospel of St. Luke. After Joseph and Mary find the missing Jesus in the Temple St. Luke says, "He returned with them to Nazareth and He grew in grace and wisdom" (Lk 2:40). Grace is God's life, and wisdom refers to learning the important things in life. Joseph and Mary were not simple bystanders watching as Jesus grew up. They weren't simple servants or onlookers. Joseph and Mary were the teachers of Jesus. And God chose them for this task. When we see the kind, gentle, compassionate things Jesus does in His life, when we see Him heal the sick, forgive sins, feed the hungry crowd because He was moved with pity for them, we catch a glimpse of what His home must have been like. When we hear Him fearlessly speak for God and challenge the authorities, we hear the sort of things His parents taught Him.

What is true for Jesus is also true for all of us. There isn't a child in our parishes who does not come from God. And God sent that child into a family. And God asks parents to do for these children of His what He asked Joseph and Mary to do for Jesus. God must have confidence in you as parents. He must believe in your ability and your potential, or else, why would He give you His sons and daughters. Children, your sheep, learn by watching the shepherd – what do they see, what do they hear, what do they learn: where are you leading them? Keep in mind, you are not called by God to be your children's friends, you are called to be their shepherds.

A brilliant professor of mine in Rome, a Dominican from County Tipperary in Ireland, Fr. Luke Dempsey OP, once said to us in class: "Gentlemen, the most important things you learn in life you learn at your mother's knee." Family – impacts us for life.



The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) has been certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO). In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, CEF-SGO provides financial, need-based scholarships to students in grades K-12 within the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

The CEF-SGO may now allow for Catholic Education supporters to be able to receive a tax credit for their generosity.
