FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Together Sunday

he way a team plays as a whole determines its success. You may have the greatest bunch of individual stars in the world, but if they don't play together, the club won't be worth a dime." – Babe Ruth

I don't know about you, but I'm pretty sure that when Babe Ruth said this, he didn't use the word "dime." In my ministry as a priest, I have been very fortunate that in each assignment I was surrounded by people who were better than me. Their greatness, strength, intelligence, wisdom, their gifts, made me a better priest and a better shepherd. That remains as true today as it has always been. I'm fortunate to be surrounded by unique, wonderful, dedicated, and gifted people. Henry Ford said, *"Coming together is a beginning; keeping together is progress; working together is a success."* I just think that together, we are stronger and together, we can realize the greatness many just dream of or hope for.

When Jesus began His public mission, He began by calling people together, first two or three, then twelve, then seventy, then after the Resurrection, five hundred. Jesus called people from all backgrounds, all social groups, all languages, nations, cultures, all states of life, all strata of society. Everyone had a gift, everyone was a gift, everyone was welcomed to share in the mission. What was true then is still true now. As St. John Henry Newman said: "God sent you into the world for a purpose."; and as the Blues Brothers say: "We are on a mission from God."

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati has designated, The Solemnity of Christ the King, November 23/24, 2024 as "Together Sunday." It is a reminder that all of us are called to belong to the One Body of Christ, forming one community of grace, all part of the one Church, and engaged in one mission for God. We are all called in different ways, but we are all called to form one community, assisting each other, sharing our gifts and talents, our resources, and our love, in building the Kingdom of God.

In many ways, we are already "together" in this journey of life and in many diverse ways, we already build the Kingdom of God together. Nevertheless, it is good to be reminded that we are in this together. I, as the pastor, realize this more than most because I see it every day, and I benefit from it more than anyone. People don't do this for me, no, you do it for God, but all of us benefit from your goodness. I am also aware that some, maybe many, have separated themselves from our community and church for one reason or another. This is also an opportunity to welcome them, to come together with us once again. Every person is invited, every gift is needed, everyone can find a home.

Over the next few weeks, we will focus on the theme of being "together" as a community. There will be an invitation to reach out to those who have "fallen away," or simply stopped practicing, or don't feel welcome. I'm asking you to ask them to return. There will be a thank-you to you for making our communities of faith such wonderful places and for all the good and kind work you do. There will also be an invitation to consider joining a ministry, a prayer group, or a parish group, to enhance our liturgy, parish life, social engagement, and commitment to each other. Your gifts are our treasure. Don't be afraid to put out into the deep and cast your net. When Jesus invited the tired apostles to do that, they caught so many fish, the nets nearly tore apart.

Thank you for all you do to build up our communities of faith, our parishes, our people. Every day, everywhere, every way, God pours out His grace through you. That makes a great difference in the lives of so many and that pleases God. His grace gives us life and our worship gives Him joy.


